What is the main theme of the 2015 edition?



The theme of the ELDW in 2015 is “Living together in multicultural societies: respect, dialogue, interaction”.

RESPECT

Living together in multicultural societies starts with the first step, which is **mutual respect**. Respect for each other’s culture, religion and traditions, on the common basis which unites us all: universal human rights. Respect for each other’s rights and differences.

DIALOGUE

The second step is **dialogue**. People who live together in the same city should have the opportunity to exchange their views on how to make the best possible use of our cultural diversity, and be understood not only by their peers, but also by the elected officials and local policy makers who are responsible for creating opportunities for dialogue.

INTERACTION

The third step is **interaction**. Local and regional authorities should find common paths and areas of action to involve diverse groups within their communities, in order to build together a more tolerant society. Examples of best practice should be identified and promoted throughout Europe.
